## Program Description PSY 325 – Sensation and Perception, with short-term travel to PARIS

Before you begin filling out the formal application on the next page, please carefully read all of the information on the front and back of this sheet.

This class, with its required short-term study abroad experience in **May of 2018**, is open to Le Moyne College undergraduate students during the Fall 2017 semester. Applicants should have at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and a clear judicial record. Others will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

As a part of the application, students must complete a short application form (attached) and submit an unofficial Le Moyne transcript. *Applications should be submitted by November* 30, 2017; earlier applications are also accepted. Applications will be reviewed and students will be notified of their application status shortly thereafter.

Accepted students will be issued a formal acceptance letter (and other paperwork) this spring outlining the process in which they can accept the program offer. Students planning to participate in the class will be required to submit a confirmation form and a completed Medical Questionnaire within one week of acceptance. After doing so, students will be enrolled in PSY 325 for the Spring of 2018.

All participants must have a clear Le Moyne Bursar account and will be required to pay the college a deposit of \$500 by December 1, and the rest of the program fee (approximately \$3897) by the beginning of the spring semester. Students who have not paid in full by that date will not be allowed to participate in the class or the travel program. Paris is an expensive city. Students will need an additional \$500-\$1000 of their own spending money for meals and other personal expenses not covered in the program price, and will need to make their own way to the point of departure, which is **Philadelphia**. The total trip cost will depend on the number of students going and a number of other factors.

Participants <u>must have a valid passport or prove that they have applied for a passport by</u> <u>the beginning of the spring semester.</u> Passports take a long time to process so students should apply early in the summer. If you have a passport, it must be valid for at least a year after we return from our trip (that is, through May, 2019).

Although there are no extraordinary physical demands anticipated, the trip does involve international travel, which by itself is taxing, and there will be extended periods of walking in Paris where it is cold in the winter. In spring, it can also be windy and rainy and/or excessively hot. (Paris is *north* of Syracuse.) Students will complete an application pledge that they have no medical conditions that prevent them from engaging in this activity. (France is not a particularly disability-friendly country.) Students who do not walk regularly are urged to begin doing so. This includes those who consider themselves in good shape, but aren't used to long walks.

Travel to Paris is undertaken as part of a Le Moyne College educational activity. Students will be representing Le Moyne in a foreign country, and their behavior reflects on the College. Conduct that is illegal, immoral, or simply disruptive will NOT be tolerated at any time, including prior to travel. Anyone who violates this code during the fall semester will not be allowed to travel with

the group. Anyone who, in the judgment of supervising professor, violates this code while in Paris will be returned to the United States at his or her own expense on the next available flight.

The program price includes roundtrip airfare between PHL Airport and Paris; 7 nights at a Paris hotel, probably the Ibis Tour Eiffel (rue Cambronne), about a 10 min. walk from the Eiffel Tower; breakfast each morning; unlimited travel on the Paris Metro (subway) in Zones 1 and 2; a Paris Pass which allows entry to a number of experiences (such as chocolate tasting) in the city; a Museum pass, that includes entry to many Museums, including the Louvre Museum; a guided walking tour of Monmatre; Evensong at Notre Dame; a visit to Studio Parfums to create custom scents; a welcome dinner; a farewell banquet and scenic boat ride on the Seine River. Please note that some of these elements may need to be adjusted depending on total course enrollment. The course is limited to 25 people.

*In addition to the program fee*, students will need to cover the costs of lunches, dinners, optional activities, and personal expenses such as gifts and souvenirs. Meal estimates are a minimum of \$50 per day for 8 days. Optional activities that will incur additional expense include museum and site passes, along with any shopping students may wish to do.
