
Orientation and Direction Within the Central Nervous System



Rostral from **ROSTRUM** — A bird's beak [& the prow of a ship]

 A conquering Roman admiral would address his forces from the prow of a ship captured in a sea battle. A ship's prow reminded people of a bird's beak. Hence, a rostrum became a place someone spoke from.

Dorsal from DORSUM — An animal or person's back

Ventral from VENTER — The belly or abdomen

• A ventriloquist speaks from the belly.

Caudal from CAUDA — The tail of a horse

• The origin of the word, **coward**, since one sees the tail of the horse when a horse rider flees from battle

Superior is ABOVE while Proximal is NEAR while Inferior is BELOW Distal is FAR
